


During the winter, USOE generates a Student Profile Report based on your fall enrollment data. This report contains all of the test results for each student enrolled at your school on Oct 1. Even students who were not at your school during the prior school year will be in the report.

The file is placed in your secure Move-it directory. It is usually a zip file that needs to be saved and unzipped with Adobe Acrobat. Put a copy of the report in the student file and share a copy with parents. The student # and name are blanked out in the example below to meet FERPA requirements.





Criterion-Referenced Tests (CRTs) are administered at the end of a course or at the end of a school year. CRTs provide information about a student's knowledge of Utah State Core Curriculum standards and objectives in the subjects of language arts, mathematics and science. Student performance is reported using a scaled score and a proficiency level. Students with a scaled score of at least 160 and a proficiency level of 3 or 4 are considered to be "proficient" or "on grade level." The graphs to the right show this student's performance on each of the CRTs and the year in which they were taken. The grade or subject when each CRT was taken is indicated along the bottom of each graph. The student's numeric scaled score on each test is indicated by the bar graph, which also shows the student's performance over time.

Math CRT




Science CRT



The Utah Basic Skills Competency Test (UBSCT) is given to high school students beginning in February of their 10th grade year. The UBSCT has three subsets (Reading, Math and Writing). Students must achieve a scaled score of 160 on each subset in order to demonstrate proficiency in that content area. Students have five opportunities to pass each of the UBSCT subsets. Once a student has passed a given subset, he/she does not need to retake it. The graph to the right shows this student's UBSCT scores for each of the subsets taken to date.


Utah Basic Skills Competency Test (UBSCT)

The Iowa Test of Basic Skills (Iowa) is given in grades 3, 5 and 8. This test compares a student's performance to a nationally "normed" group. Scores are reported as "percentile ranks." A percentile rank of 58 means the student did as well as, or better than, 58% of the students in the norm group who took the same test (it does not mean the student scored 58% correct). The national average is represented by a percentile rank of 50.

Iowa Tests



The Direct Writing Assessment (DWA) is given to students in grades 6 and 9, and measures each student's proficiency on persuasive writing skills. Scores are reported as both "points earned" on the six traits of writing (30 pts. possible) and proficiency level (levels 1-4), with a 3 or 4 considered proficient.
