

Statewide Public Education Online Program (SPEOP) - AMES' Online Credit Options

The Academy of Math, Engineering and Science has provided a list of three options for current and prospective students who want to either accelerate credit (i.e., take courses outside of regular class time), remediate or recover lost credit (i.e., failed class), and/or original credit as per the new Utah Code and **Statewide Public Education Online Program**: <http://www.schools.utah.gov/edonline/students-and-parents.aspx> . As per the new rule (2011), students and parents can select up to two classes and have the costs be covered as part of their public education.

AMES has partnered with the following educational entities for students to earn such credits that will transfer directly to AMES. Please ensure to notify your AMES' guidance counselor before you start online course options to ensure you are working towards credit required for graduation and your SEOP (Student Educational Occupational Plan).

1. Electronic High School:

- c. Courses are generally free to take, but exams may cost a nominal fee for test proctoring
- d. Courses are offered in quarter increments or (.25 credit)

- c. Courses range from \$43.00 to \$126.00 on average
- d. Courses are offered in semester increments (.50 credit)
